





Communion will be distributed separately to each side of the congregation, first to the left side, then to the right side. Please walk down the center aisle where you may receive the elements. The wine is red and grape juice is white. Gluten free wafers are available on request.

If you wish not to receive communion, simply cross your arms across your chest to receive a blessing and, if you wish, an anointing with oil.

After receiving the elements if you choose, you may also receive an anointing with oil. This anointing on your forehead is a very old gesture used to give strength on the journey of being healed and healing others.
